ABMB Activity Report

Sending African missionaries to African mission fields (It's cheaper than how mission work has been carried out to date).

Provoking a missionary movement on the continent of Africa by challenging, inspiring, raising, training, equipping, sending and supporting Young African Missionaries to conquer hearts and territories for Christ Jesus, our Lord and Savior; this is what we stand for.

Africa has the manpower, and the sub-Saharan Africa has a huge population of Young Christian to the extend that, if the Church organizes itself through the Lordship of Jesus Christ in the Power of the Holy Spirit, the Gospel will reach the hidden unreached people.

With these mindset ABMB was launched in December 2023 and appointed his coordinator on October 2024.

- The Mission Director manages various programs ranging from Youth Mission Year, Last Quarter Evangelism, GO Movement.
- Short, Middle and Long-Term Missionaries sending, Mission Trainings, etc.
- Coordinates the various Social Development, Aid and Relief Programs.
- Help to develop the prayer lifestyle of missionaries.
- Appraises the work of the various Missionaries and grants necessary supports within the official jurisdictions.
- Coordinates Church Planting initiatives and carry out thorough assessment while also give necessary recommendations.
- Coordinates and sees to adequate remunerations of everyone connected to the ABMB.
- Ensure monitor, evaluate, and report on all program activities and progress to headquarter office and donors.
- Report regularly to headquarters, providing timely updates of all operational situational and project management developments.
- Fosters the relationship between the organization and the host communities of our various Mission field.
- Visit Mission fields, attend emergencies where the need arises, care for the general welfare.
- Mobilize, equip, and network Mission Personnels of Member Bodies to take the Gospel farther within and outside Africa.
- Aligning with global mission and social development organizations for effective partnership that makes the organization to be well positioned.
- Initiate and organize Mission Conferences to stimulate the consciousness for Mission across the AABF Family.
- Prepare, present, and defend reports during Annual Gatherings of the organization.
- Prepare and keep records of AABF collaboration with JMM of Brazil Baptist Convention.
- Communicates the activities of the ABMB to the communication department of AABF and other media platforms for improved projection.
- Coordinate production of Mission Materials in different languages to foster the penetration of the Gospel.

2. Achievements

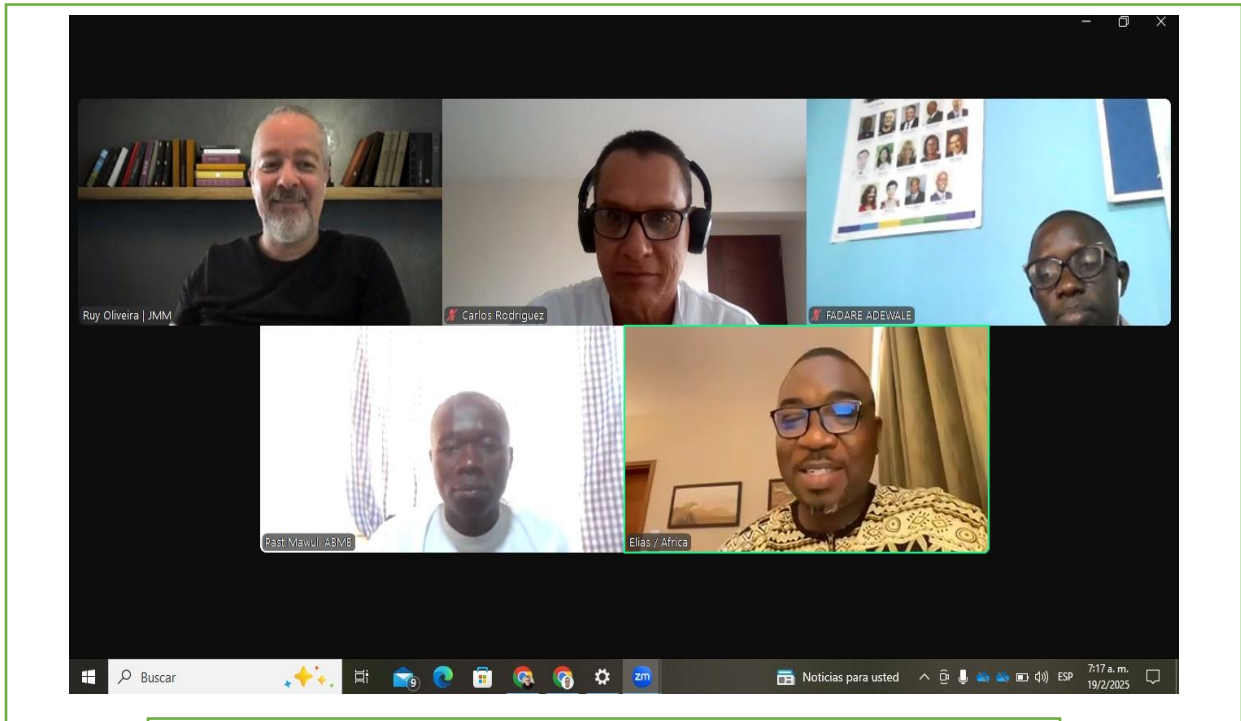
Since taking office, we have:

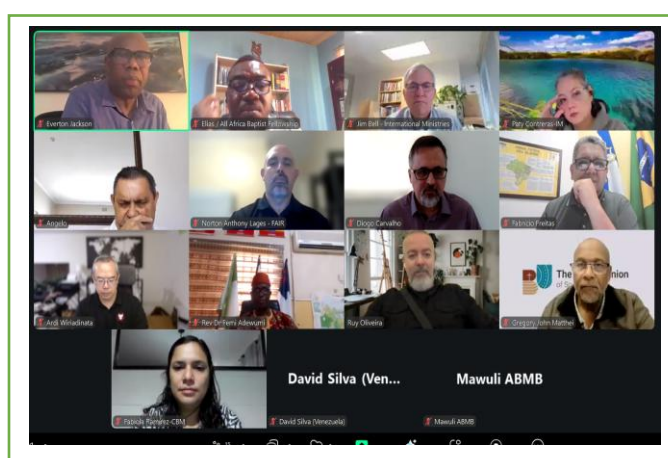

The first meeting presented the current state of mission in Africa and the missionary strategies of AABF. The speaker was Pastor Elias Apetogbo, SG & CEO of AABF, on April 10, 2025.

The second meeting focused on exploring mission opportunities for networking in Latin America, the region of the Union of Latin American Baptists (UBLA), presented by Fabricio Freitas, the new CEO of the National Council of Missions of Brazil, on September 18, 2025.

a. Last Quarter Evangelism 2024

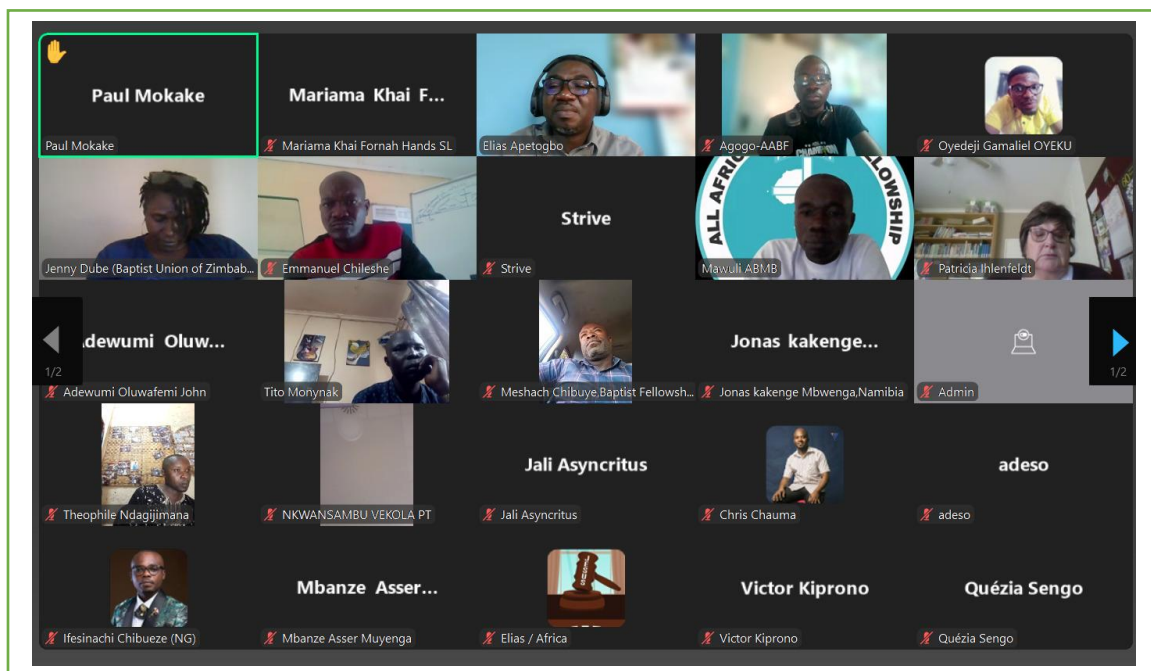

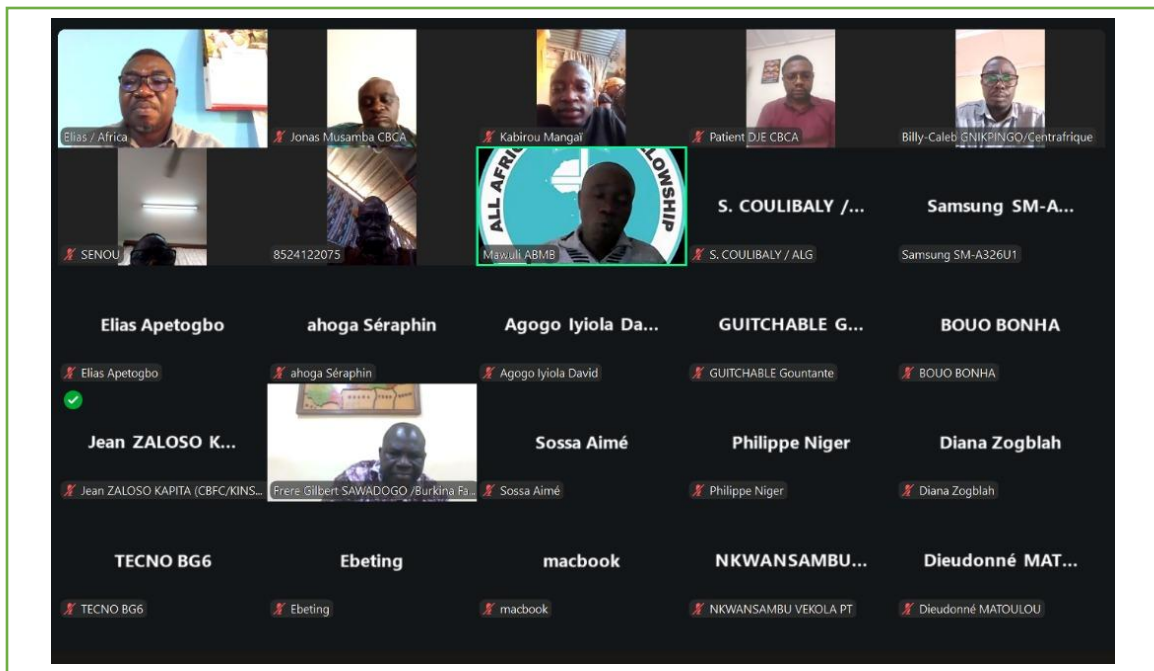

VI. Management of AABF missionaries with YMY program

One of AABF's strategies for bringing the gospel to the continent is the YMY program, which stands for Youth Mission Year. This program, in its first year, has enabled us to place eight young people in the mission field. They serve to plant churches, strengthening, home cells leaders, discipleship, evangelism, and children clubs. Each mission field has its own specialty, so we have:

- **Gambia:** Two missionaries working to build the capacity of church members and establish and energize churches auxiliary.

- A missionary in South Africa is initiating a discipleship program in the workplace.

We don't just send them out, we maintain constant contact with the missionaries through a weekly prayer program every Thursday to build capacity and manage personal challenges.

Note

Due to some administrative issues, one of the missionaries serving in Namibia has returned to his denomination and continues to serve in the mission but not on behalf of AABF. Discussions are underway to resolve the situation.

Response

We are still in the process of developing a program to be implemented, but we would like to highlight a few specific actions that AABF has taken.

Support for the DRC during the recent war in Kivu.

Intervention in Niger to relocate Baptist brothers whose homes and churches were invaded by terrorists.

Challenges

- Few AABF member organizations have mission-evangelism departments, so we do not have actual data on the mission in the field.
- Lack of training structures for mission, especially for integral and intercultural mission.

- Low financial mobilization for mission.
- Lack of missionary initiative from member bodies.
- Lack of equipment for our missionaries

Outlook

- Equipping our missionaries with means of transportation



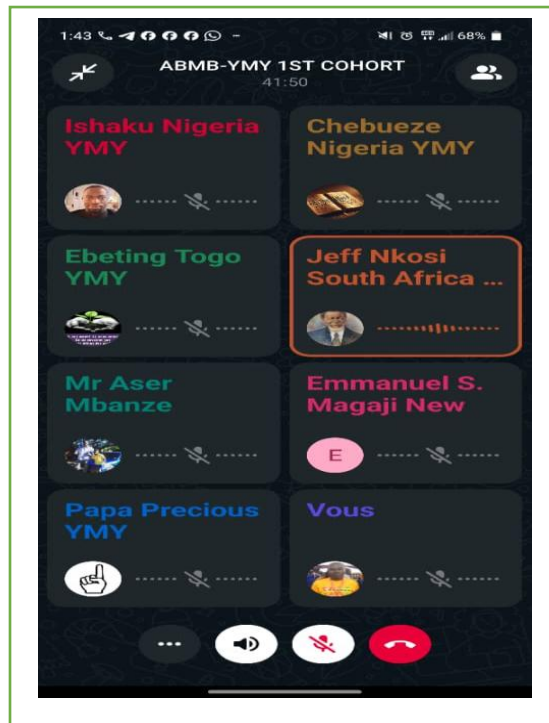

- Organize training and information sessions to keep the flame of mission alive

- Raise train and send 3 couples of missionaries from Ethiopia to Somalia, Eritrea and Dibouti

For the well-being and regular monitoring of YMY missionaries, a weekly prayer meeting program is organized, which each missionary must automatically attend every Thursday from 12 p.m. to 1 p.m. GMT.



Conclusion

The initiative is commendable and deserves to be understood and supported. For those who hesitate at any level, I remind you that we are stewards on earth and the Great Commission is an obligation, not a choice. Information suggests that the center of gravity of the gospel is shifting to Africa, but the church does not seem concerned about the heavy responsibility that awaits it and the work of changing the paradigm of the mission mentality, which seems to be devolved solely to white people. Furthermore, Africa presents an unconvincing picture when it comes to mission: the north is still under Islamic domination, the center is in conflict between Christianity and Islam, and the south is dominated by Christian syncretism. This painting invites us not to sit idly by or adopt an individualistic approach to the mission, but to join hands and present a united front against all forms of religion, so that this scripture will continue to be sung among Africans “I have chosen you from among this people and

from among the Gentiles, to whom I am sending you, to open their eyes, so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the power of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me” Acts 26:17-18.
